



CARMEN HELPING OTHERS

The CBT is the means by which the Livery gives charitable funds to help education, our transport and logistics industries and more broadly, where the disadvantaged are held back from fully contributing to society because of poverty or lack of opportunity.

Income is derived from donations from individual Carmen, but, sadly, these are significantly fewer than ten years ago. The Trust is always pleased to receive new standing orders or donations by other means, but, unless income increases, its work will have to be reduced. Already,

two-thirds of grants are funded from growth in the value of investments rather than from donations. The impact of any recession that may occur would be devastating, not just to the Trust, and those who rely on its support, but to the image and standing of the Livery itself.

Time was when almost every new Carmen signed a standing order to help the Trust do its work. Unfortunately, that is no longer the case. Benevolence is at the very heart of the Livery and, as our Chairman, Past Senior Warden Iain Golder, points out, we need to see a

much greater proportion of Carmen contributing. The present situation does not give confidence for the future. Our Crowdfunding appeals are quite successful, but they are not a substitute for secure long-term funding.

Please think about what YOU can do to help the Trust reach its objectives. Your payments don't have to be substantial. Moderate contributions from every Carman would make all the difference.

NATIONAL YOUTH ORCHESTRA (LONDON)

Your trustees have extended the help offered to young musicians by making a grant to the National Youth Orchestra (NYO). This is a world-first, an ambitious orchestra which gives some of the UK's most talented disabled musicians a progression route in the performing arts. Through collaboration with cutting-edge composers, NYO supports disabled and non-disabled musicians aged between 11 and 25 to rehearse and perform together as members of a pioneering inclusive ensemble. Many young disabled musicians rarely get the chance to spend time around their peers, and the Trust is pleased to devote some of its resources to helping them achieve.

SUPPORTING EDUCATION

The Trust has always devoted resources to helping disadvantaged youngsters reach their potential. This takes many forms, including help for students at schools which enjoy City support (for example, Christ's Hospital and King Edward's School, Witley). Help for schools and their students continues to be a priority for the Trust, but the trustees are now focusing help for education on projects such as facilities or bursaries and new means of supporting students.

We recently visited King Edward's School, Witley (Surrey), to discuss future support and have funded the conversion of a further area at Aldgate School (the only State school in the City) to help youngsters – support gratefully received by the school, which is proud to record the help given by the Trust.
